He has impending doom and believes his life will soon come to an end. Respiratory viral panel positive for parapneumovirus.

Chief complaint: Gunshot wound

Unidentified 22-year-old man with GSW to the abdomen, came in with signs of hypovolemic shock. He was taken to the OR for ex-lap to identify and control the source of bleeding. Resuscitative efforts were vain.

Chief complaint: Right-sided weakness

81-year-old woman with unknown PMH developed right-sided hemiplegia, found to have left fronto-temporal subdural hematoma, with midline shift on CT brain without contrast. The patient is going to the OR for hematoma evacuation.

It was difficult to obtain history because thought process is extremely tangential with loose associations.
