The Placebo Concept in Medicine and Psychiatry

The standard technical vocabulary used to define placebo therapies and experimental placebo controls in medicine and psychiatry is both confusing and obscure. To achieve conceptual clarity in the theory of placebogenic phenomena, this presentation offers (i) a rigorous articulation of the placebo concept, (ii) a lucid new terminology, and (iii) a substantial revamping of A.K. Shapiro's influential prior definition of "placebo." This analysis has a number of consequences for ethical issues surrounding use of placebos.
