A long and useful tradition of human subjects protection, forged in the crucibles of Nuremburg and Tuskegee, is no longer adequate to the challenges of 21st-century bioscience: Risks and benefits are different, consent has evolved and privacy is no longer about protecting patient information in paper binders. A nimbler and more nuanced IRB will help protect civil and human rights, better capture the values of ordinary people and ensure the shared benefits of translational science.

Dr. Goodman, a former member of the University of Miami IRB, directs UM's Bioethics Program. He is Professor of Medicine and jointly of Philosophy and other departments.
